
NATURE PHOTOGRAPHY WORKSHOP

News, views, rumors, info and tips for camera lovers

Canon has announced the latest addition to its line of DSLRs, the EOS 500D/Rebel T1i. In addition an entry level flashgun, the Speedlite 270EX which replaces the Speedlite 220EX is a smaller, more compact unit and is powered by two AA batteries. It is compatible with all recent Canon cameras.

The new Rebel has a 15.1 MP APS-C CMOS sensor with 1080p HD video recording and live view. It has a 3.0 inch high resolution LCD similar to that in the new 5D Mark 2 and the EOS 50D. It uses the new Digic 4 processor which is also used in other two models. The 500D has an ISO sensitivity range expandable up to 12800 equivalent. This Rebel can deliver 170 large JPEG images in a single burst. The camera body alone lists for \$799 or in a kit with an 18-55 IS lens for \$899. It is due for release in May. Early reviews are very favorable for this Rebel flagship.

With HD Video capabilities now being incorporated in DSLRs, the question being discussed is whether or not these cameras will be allowed in professional sports arenas either by amateurs or even professional photographers who do not have explicit permission to shoot video. Yankee

Stadium, for one, has a rule banning anything other than single-frame flash photography. On the no-no list are tripods, extended length zoom lenses, other professional camera equipment, movie cameras and any other video or audio recording equipment.

Will camera makers produce the high end DSLRs that professional sports photographers use with video capabilities included or not? This topic is being hotly debated in photography forums. Does this rule mean that anyone showing up at Yankee Stadium with a Nikon D90, a Canon 5D Mark 2 or the just announced to be released Canon 500D/ Rebel T1i will be prevented from entering? Considering they all shoot HD video, we'll have to wait and see. The answer should be forthcoming shortly. Yes, point & shoot cameras shoot video but apparently pro sports does not feel threatened by their capabilities.

Carl Zeiss will be producing a Canon mount version of its 18mm F3.5 lens. Previously it has only been available in mounts for Nikon and Pentax cameras.

A firmware update has just been released for the Olympus E-30 DSLR.

Ritz Camera will start liquidating more than 300 of its over 600 stores on April 4th. Several are in New Jersey including one in Bedminster on Route 206 in the Hills Shopping Center.

Olympus has announced an upgrade to its four thirds model E-420 with the new E-450. It has been described by one professional reviewer as having the fewest changes ever seen over the existing model. The main new features are three Art Filters for creativity, a new processor, improved live view and a brightened LCD. This is a very lightweight and compact 10 MP camera and based on the reputation of the popular E-420 this model should be easy to use right out of the box. It will be available in May for an estimated list price of \$699 which includes both the 14-42 MM and 40-150 MM lenses. In case you haven't figured out already who this camera is targeted at, it will be available exclusively on May 9^{th} on QVC. Now you know.

Now hear this, the \$699 kit price with two lenses is not a misprint. At first I thought it might be but the next day I was reading "The New York Times" and came across an ad by "J&R" in New York. They were advertising the Nikon D60 two lens kit including an AF-S DX 18-55 and an AF-S DX 55-200 for \$699.95 after a \$150 instant rebate plus a \$50 gift card with purchase of the D60/KITZ. This offer expires 4/18/09. Could it be that a new Nikon entry level DSLR will be revealed at their 4/14 press conference?

Canon announced the release of two new high end printers. The Pixma Pro9500 Mark II has a list price of \$849 and the Pixma Pro9000 at \$499.

Wacom has released its new line of Intous4 Tablets for PCs and Macs in four sizes.

Want to give a try at HDR? Get a free download of Photomatix basic 1.2 at <u>www.hdrsoft.com</u> and click on the Download tab. Scroll down to select this Freeware. It's available for Windows.

Canon has announced it has produced over 10 million DSLRs since the launch of the EOS Rebel/300D in 2003.

People are taking zillions of photos with point & shoot cameras firing off their flash units uselessly at concerts and sports events from distances almost as far as Tiger Woods can hit a seven iron. Wow, the flash in my DSLR doesn't work from that far away.


