#### Previsualization by Rick Berger Hub Camera Club

Athletes do it. Entertainers do it. Artists do it. Photographers do it. So what is previsualization? It's seeing something in your mind's eye before the actual event occurs.

Even before a batter steps up to the plate he often imagines himself standing at home plate in the proper stance then swinging his bat and continuing his follow-through as the bat and ball connect. An entertainer, before stepping onto the stage, envisions himself standing in the spotlight reciting his lines or perhaps singing using particular movements and gestures to convey a message and communicate with the audience. An artist stares at a blank canvas conjuring up what the image will look like after he applies paint, pastels, pencil, or whatever medium will be used to create that piece of art. As a photographer, you too can employ the technique of previsualization to help you create a more powerful image.

Even before you press the shutter release button, take a look at what your camera is viewing. Try to see what the camera is seeing, then try to envision what you want it to see. Imagine what your picture will look like after the click. Think to yourself, "Is this really what I want my shot to look like?" Too many of us simply take a look through the viewfinder, go click and go home, figuring that however it comes out we can fix it once we're sitting in front of our computers. Imagine how much better our shot would be if, when we sat down at the computer, the image were already as we had envisioned it. Now all we'd have to do is tweak it to make it better.

Actors often delve into their character's motivation for behaving the way they do. Before taking on a role or setting foot on the stage they attempt to determine why a person they're portraying would act, speak, or move in a certain manner. As a photographer who wants to produce the best image possible, you should ask questions such as, "What is my motivation for taking this shot? Why do I want to take this particular picture? What do I see that's making me think that this shot is worth shooting? Is it the lighting, the texture, the color that I like? Is it the overall scene or just part of it that appeals to me?" Once you've answered questions like these you can feel confident in clicking that shutter button. Photography is often more of a thought process than a physical one. After you've figured out what you're really trying to get onto that memory card, the easy part is pushing the button and hearing the click of the shutter.

Photography is fun, but to get really good results we have to work at having that fun. It all comes together when people tell you that they enjoy your photos. Now grab your camera, go out there, and previsualize!
